For the past twenty years, Maureen Taylor has been a driving force in Habitat for Humanity. Maureen and her husband, Richard Taylor, co-founded Habitat for Humanity of Southern Dutchess in 1994. In 1997 the organization merged with Poughkeepsie to become the Dutchess County Habitat for Humanity. Maureen was a member of the Board of Directors from 1994 to 2013 and served as assistant treasurer.

From 1996 to the present she has been chair of the Family Support Committee. Maureen's work for Habitat has included three Jimmy Carter Blitz Builds in South Dakota, Kentucky and Texas. Her other activities include Make-a-Difference Day

projects, home repairs, and Community Days parades. She has worked tirelessly to raise funds for the organization by conducting annual Gingerbread House raffles, organizing barn sales, flea markets, and antique/collectables appraisals and participating in walk-a-thons.
