# What exactly is Domestic Violence?

<u>Definition of DV-</u> Domestic Violence is the willful intimidation, <u>physical assault battery, sexual assault</u> and/or other abusive behavior perpetrated by an intimate partner against another.

It is an epidemic affecting individuals in <u>every community</u>, regardless of age, <u>economic status</u>, <u>race</u>, <u>religion</u>, <u>nationality</u> or <u>educational background</u>.

Violence against women is often accompanied by emotionally abusive and controlling behavior, and is a part of a systematic pattern of dominance and control.

Domestic Violence results in <u>physical injury</u>, <u>psychological trauma</u>, and sometimes <u>death</u>.

The consequences of DV can cross generations and last a lifetime.

### Domestic Violence (DV) Facts

- 1.1 in 4 women will experience Domestic Violence in her lifetime.
- 2.1.3 million women are victims of physical assault by an intimate partner each year.
- 3. Females have been most often victimized by someone they knew.
- 4. Females who are 20-24 years of age are at the greatest risk of nonfatal intimate partner violence
- 5. Most cases of Domestic Violence are never reported to the police.

### Homicide & Injury

- 1. Almost 1/3 of female homicide victims that are reported in police records are killed by an intimate partner.
- 2. In 70% 80% of intimate partner homicides the man physically abused the woman before the murder.
- 3. Less than 1/5 of victims reporting an injury from intimate partner violence sought medical treatment following the injury.
- 4. Intimate partner violence results in more than 18.5 million mental health care visits each year.

#### Sexual Assault

- 1.1 in 6 women and 1 in 33 men have experienced an attempted or completed rape.
- 2. Nearly 7.8 million women have been raped by an intimate partner at some point in their lives.
- 3. Sexual assault or forced sex occurs in approximately 40 to 50% of battering relationships.

#### Children Who Witness

- 1. Witnessing violence between one's parents or caretakers is the strongest risk factor of transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next.
- 2. Boys who witness domestic violence are twice as likely to abuse their own partners and children when they become adults.
- 3. 30% to 60% of perpetrators of intimate partner violence also abuse children in the household.

## **Economic Impact**

- 1. The cost of intimate partner violence exceeds \$5.8 billion each year, \$4.1 billion of which is for direct medical and mental health services.
- 2. Victims of intimate partner violence lost almost 8 million days of paid work because of the vjolence perpetrated against them by current or former husbands, boyfriends and dates. This loss is the equivalent of more than 32,000 full-time jobs and almost 5.6 million days of household productivity as a result of violence.
- 3. There are 16,800 homicides and \$2.2 million medically treated injuries due to intimate partner violence annually, which costs \$37 billion.
