Rebel Hearts: Fight for Social Justice

Our program takes a look at the **Los Angeles's Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary**, nuns who challenged the patriarchal conventions of the Catholic Church 50 years ago and are still taking a stand today. They had, and continue to have, a vocation of social justice.

After an introduction by **AAUW Member Cathy Kinn**, we will view the beginning half of the film. Cathy entered the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary at age 18 in 1953 and left the community 14 years later. There will be time for questions and discussion.

Rebel Hearts, a 2021 highly acclaimed

American documentary film, directed and produced by Pedro Kos, traces the joyous and fearless evolution from average to extraordinary. The defiant nuns from the order The Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Los Angeles put their habits on the line to prove that religious devotion does not equate with uncritical submissiveness. They fought for equality, their livelihoods and their own freedom against an all-powerful hierarchy. In the 1960's, the group supported social justice causes, and denounced the Viet Nam War. ANNUAL MEETING –Guest Speaker Dr. Lucia Cherciu

Dutchess County Poet Laureate, 2021 and 2022

Dr. Lucia Cherciu is the 2021 and 2022 Dutchess County Poet Laureate. She was born in Romania and came to the United States as a graduate student in 1995. She received her Ph.D. in English from Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a dissertation on women and laughter, titled "Ludicrous 'Scribbling Women': The Politics of Laughter and Nineteenth-



Century American Women Writers." She is a Professor of English at SUNY / Dutchess Community College in Poughkeepsie, NY. She is the author of five books of poetry: Train Ride to Bucharest (Sheep Meadow Press, 2017), which received the Eugene Paul Nassar Poetry Prize, Edible Flowers (Main Street Rag, 2016), Lalele din Paradis / Tulips in Paradise (Editura Eikon, 2017), Altoiul Râsului / Grafted Laughter (Editura Brumar, 2010), and Lepădarea de Limbă / The Abandonment of Language (Editura Vinea, 2009).

She writes both in English and in Romanian but does not translate her own work. Her poetry was nominated three times for a Pushcart Prize and twice for Best of the Net. Her work appeared in "Antioch Review," "Connecticut Review," "Connotation Press," "Cortland Review," "Interdisciplinary Studies in Literature and the Environment," "Paterson Literary Review," "Poetry East," and in many Romanian literary magazines, such as "Timpul," "Hyperion," "Contrapunct," and "Astra." Her first novel, I Didn't Send You There, is currently on submission. Her web page is http://luciacherciu.webs.com.

I urge you to research your school board candidates this year, as there have been speakers at some school board meetings recently who advocate for policies or policy changes that do not represent the mission and goals of AAUW.

Continuing from the April Public Policy article I wrote, is another section of the "Biennial Action Priorities" adopted by AAUW in May of 2021 as the "Public Policy Priorities for 2021-2023.

To guarantee equality, individual rights, and social justice for a diverse and inclusive society, AAUW advocates

- Vigorous enforcement of and full access to civil and constitutional rights, including affirmative action and expanding voting rights
- Complete, accurate and timely collection of data, disaggregated by race, ethnicity, and gender identity to inform policy decisions and the apportionment of political representation
- Self-determination of one's reproductive health decisions
- Universal access to quality, affordable health care, including insurance, and comprehensive family planning services, including expansion of patients' rights
- Freedom from violence and fear of violence, including hate crimes, in homes, schools, workplaces, and communities
- Support for U.N. programs that address human rights and women's and girls' concerns
- Freedom in the definition of self and family, including protection from discrimination and a guarantee of civil rights for all family structures
- Passage and ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment

Aadya Gorti, was the overwhelming winner. All three judges were extremely impressed with the research this young 13 year old had done and the knowledge she possessed of her subject. Aadya was presented a certificate designating her as the



recipient of the Poughkeepsie Branch AAUW STEM Award and a \$50 gift certificate to Barnes and Noble.

Thank you to our members of AAUW Poughkeepsie Branch and Days for Girls Poughkeepsie NY volunteers for the overwhelming response to our call for donations for disposable pads for Ukraine refugee relief. In four days, from 3/14/2022 to 3/18/2022, we collected 8468 disposable pads! We also donated 40 pairs of underwear and soap. Poughkeepsie branch member and consistent Days for Girls volunteer, Darlene Yerdon, drove these donations—plus disposable pads donated at the Poughkeepsie Galleria site—to the Days for Girls Chapter in Pittsburgh, PA, enabling us to save on shipping costs.

At the DfG Pittsburgh Chapter

collection point these pads were added to our supreme DfG kits to make hybrid kits, providing refugees options to manage their menstrual needs while on the move. The Pittsburgh collection point shipped three pallets of hybrid kits and four pallets of disposable products.

Our heartfelt gratitude goes out to Monique Jones and Margaret Nijhuis for informing our membership of our drive on very short notice. Thank you, Darlene, for collecting, loading your car and delivering the pads to the collection point. Special thanks also to our youngest volunteer, Natalie Ronen, whose Amazon drive collected 1678 pads. Thank you to Judy Longacre, who collected pads at her home, made

sure that the pads accumulating outside my office were inside at the end of the day, and helped
