Out of Court and Off the Record

When it comes to women's working issues, it seems men don't want to go to court. Is it because they are afraid of what the record will reveal or because they know they should have done the right thing in the first place?



Though decades apart, two major cases affecting women's pay and working conditions in the financial sector opted for out-of-court settlements. Goldman Sachs, rather than get a court ruling, negotiated an out-of-court settlement with its female employees. GS agreed to pay \$215 million to put an end to a long-running class-action lawsuit that accused the Wall Street giant of systemically underpaying women, unfairly evaluating job performance and denying equally qualified women promotions. As part of the settlement, Goldman Sachs will engage an independent expert to conduct additional analysis on performance evaluation processes, as well as its process for promotion, over a three year period.

Experts say a court hearing "would have provided a rare public forum for testimony about inequality inside the financial industry, where all but one of the six biggest US banks have only ever been run by men." They did not wish to go on the record and provide facts and data.

The \$215 million settlement is bigger than the \$150 million that Smith Barney paid decades ago to end what was known as the Boom-Boom Room suit. SB was accused of vulgar sexual harassment, discrimination, unfair pay and promotion denial.

While the overt vulgar sexual harassment issues have somewhat quelled, the finance and insurance industries continue to be leaders in maintaining the gender gap. At the time of the SB settlement, women were making 70 cents on the dollar. Currently, the gap in the finance market is one of the larger gender gaps with women earning 17% less than men. For every dollar earned by men, women earned 82 cents - an increase of 12 cents an hour from a quarter century ago. Women comprise 56% of the financial sector workforce with men staffing the majority of the higher/highest positions.

AAUW continues to advocate for equal pay and the elimination of the gender gap. We have consistently pressed forward with our agenda to eliminate the gender gap and improve the climate for working women. If you haven't already, visit https://www.aauw.org/act/two-minute-activist/ to advocate to your legislators their need to support opportunities for fairness, equal pay and equality for women and their interests. It takes 2 minutes. You will find current bills waiting for your input. Now is the time to "audition" your representatives before election decisions are due. With your help, AAUW will continue do its job. We are not afraid to go on the record.

Maggie hopes this conference "will build her confidence as a strong woman," and let her "learn tactics to address inequities towards women, and gain a network of mentors." Her professor, Robin Diller Torres, feels Maggie will fit right in at this conference. "Maggie is a proactive learner and leader who shows initiative, resilience, potential, and results."

We will receive a "report" when they return, and I am so happy NCCWSL is "in person" again. Thank you to all the committee members who worked on this scholarship.
