## President's 2022-2023 Annual Report

This past year brought us some relief from the COVID pandemic restrictions, allowing us to have an in person Open House in September, 2022. Our Membership Chairs, Mary Scalise-Annis and Bonnie Auchincloss did a fantastic job in organizing and implementing the event. We had several attendees register as new members or as returning members that evening. It was a celebratory event giving us hope that we could continue with in-person events throughout the year. And, we did!

In November we had a fund-raising event held at the Beekman Arms that was both entertaining and educational, and in April we honored Jewel Ratzlaff as our Woman of the Year. I am proud to say that you, the members of Poughkeepsie AAUW, attended and supported both these events.

By the time this report is published on our website, we will have had our Annual Meeting at the Poughkeepsie Grand Hotel on June 8, 2023. We will have come together to honor our Cornerstone Awardee, our long-time members, and hear our guest speaker Malaine Rottcamp, CEO and President of Dutchess County Tourism. Our previous required business meeting was held in November at one of our program meetings. Minutes of that meeting as well as the Annual Meeting are archived on our website.

Using Zoom, I presided over nine Board meetings this year, exceeding the Working Rules requirement of seven. The Board worked diligently on members' behalf carrying on the business of our branch. I am grateful for the Board's support as I began my first term as President. As exhausting as that may sound, it was not. I was energized by the information I gleaned from these events. I look forward to my second term as your President.

During the summer some of us will work on reviewing our Strategic Plan, clarifying language in our Working Rules regarding Development and the Honors and Awards Chair, and either continuing the Girls Conference or initiating an event that will involve middle or high school girls that will enhance their skills in achieving equity for themselves.

Volunteerism is the bedrock of our organization. We need your active support.
