Program Vice-Presidents Report to the Board for 2022-23 year

The Program Committee consisted of Co-VPS Maria DeWald and Marcine Humphrey as well as Mary Coiteux, Beth DeFiglio, Barbara Durniak, Betty Harrel, Gwen Higgins, Diane Jablonski, Sandy Lash, Jackie Goffe-McNish, and Margaret Nijhuis.

Monthly program meetings were held and were a mix of in-person at our new site, the Freedom Plains United Presbyterian Church on Route 55, and ZOOM. In-person programs were held October-December and March through May with the January-February programs presented via ZOOM. A variety of interesting, mission-based topics were covered and attended by 25-35 people in-person (60 at the May program when Woodland Pond sent a bus with 15 attendees) and 40-50 online. We received many positive comments indicating the programs were enjoyed, interesting and inspirational.

As always, our meetings were held on the second Thursday of the month from 7PM to 8:45PM. Since our Branch programs are free and open to the public, we did sometimes have non-members in attendance.

For each ZOOM Program, a short Practice meeting with the presenter and members of the Program Committee was held in advance to assure efficient technology needs were in place. For in-person meetings, we assured chair set up, a resource table, sometimes a membership table and technology were in order. Regarding refreshments, we could never find a new facilitator so we first stopped offering coffee/tea with no complaints and moved to very light offerings of water/soft drinks/juices and a few snacks such as cookies/candy/clementines which Marcine brought. We will need to decide how to proceed next year and whether to phase this out completely or continue to offer light refreshments mostly depending on volunteers.

In addition, notification of upcoming programs was reported to AAUW NY and we had occasional representation from other Branches accordingly, particularly Kingston Branch. It is recommended we continue to expand marketing of programs to places such as Woodland Pond, the Church and other organizations

A marketing flier was developed for each program with the assistance of Margaret Nijhuis and printed in the Branch as well as sent as a reminder three times before each program. All Program registrants were also reminded about the programs a few days before each presentation. For ZOOM, we used the AAUW ZOOM account, registration was required and a reminder sent a few days before.

Our budget for next year raises the honorarium from \$50 to \$100 which can come in the form of a donation, a gift card, a dinner voucher or any appropriate format.
