Our structural palate is varied and includes a combination of deep studies of individual styles or poets, poetry based on particular themes/times/techniques and plays of all kinds ranging from earliest times to the present. This past year that included a trip to the Hudson Valley Shakespeare Theatre to see Agatha Christie's "The Murder of Roger Ackroyd". Some examples of various approaches to poetry are: poems of our ancestors* voices of social protest* female poets* Poet Laureates* poems that make us ponder* perhaps a book such as "Brown Girl dreaming written all in poetic prose as part of a Black History Month* Pick-Your-Own Poem/Poet" sharing days * different movements such as the Imagist Movement * different techniques such as dramatic monologue or how punctuation affects poems * field trips such as to Innisfree Garden to read bird poems or Quiet Cove Riverside Park to discuss/listen to music lyrics as poetry* sometimes a play in film format such as those by August Wilson, great soliloquies, or a short play which we all read aloud together* Warning: We are serendipitous. Please know our group members range from a professional poet to an interested math major to folks who have never read poetry before to poetry lovers to just lovers of the written word in any form and more.
